

## 27th Avenue, Palm Beach Seawall

The 27th Avenue Palm Beach Seawall Construction Project forms part of the Three Point Plan for Coastal Protection, which fast-tracks the implementation of 30 years' worth of beach protection works under the City's Ocean Beaches Strategy.

Ocean seawall improvement works at Twenty Seventh Avenue, Palm Beach, will commence in April 2015.

These works are expected to be finalised during August 2015. Once completed, the newly constructed seawall will improve the resilience of community infrastructure to coastal erosion during extreme weather events.

During these works, sand will be removed to enable the boulder wall to be constructed. The boulder wall will then be covered with sand and complimentary works including the restoration of the foreshore and the reinstatement of furniture, pavements and vegetation will be carried out.



### Features

Cost: \$1.1 million

- Major work with heavy equipment is likely to take four months until August 2015.
- Like-for-like vegetation will be reinstated.
- The newly constructed seawall will improve the resilience of community infrastructure to coastal erosion during extreme weather events.

- Reinstatement of all existing beach furniture, pavements and associated vegetation will be carried out after construction.

### **Schedule of works**

Commencement: April 2015

Completion: August 2015

### **Construction impacts**

A project site office will be established in Twenty Seventh Avenue to accommodate heavy machinery and construction materials. Please note that temporary traffic control arrangements will be in place during the construction period, however pedestrian access to the beach and adjacent residential areas will be maintained.
